Tasks once a fortnight	English	• 3 short tasks: reading, writing & vocab • Tasks on Teams • Complete multiple-choice and extended writing as a pair as these tasks link together • What/how/why paragraph structure should be followed for extended analytical writing, with at least two decent paragraphs of writing expected. • Students are also expected to be reading for pleasure on a weekly basis; this will help improve their reading speed and comprehension across <u>all</u> subjects.
	Maths	Prep homework sheet, given out fortnightly. Pupils should work independently on the topics on the sheet. Followed up with a low stakes quiz in lessons.
	Science	• Knowledge organiser on Teams to revise • Complete revision quiz on Teams (via BigTeach)
	Geography	• Variable tasks set including: Teams Retrieval Quizzes, paper-based revision tasks and Learning Key Vocabulary
	History	• Knowledge organiser / Vocabulary lists on Beehive to revise • Complete set tasks in homework booklet to consolidate knowledge.
	RE	• Key term or key question quiz • Revision sheet for EOT test
	French	• Vocab quizzes via Teams, VLE or Languagenut • Preparation for assessments as directed on Beehive

Science	• Mindmap or exam questions • Exam questions must be marked by pupils too (mark scheme will be on beehive) • Green book used for homework
Geography	• Exam practice booklet • Pupils must mark their work in green pen too • Various revision and retrieval tasks set in lessons
History	• Set tasks in revision booklets weekly these include quizzes and practice questions / plans
